

The British Hip Society and Smith & Nephew Fellowship.

The British Hip Society and Smith & Nephew Fellowship is open to one or more fellows, depending on the time the fellow or fellows are able to spend away from their unit. We expect there to be enough funding for two four months attachments, or potentially for one six months attachments and a second shorter attachment. The fellows will be given a stipend with additional funding to support travel to and from the fellowship and for other relevant educational events. Total funds available to cover fellow stipend and hosting sites amount to £43000.

The fellow would attend units in the UK to gain extra exposure to hip resurfacing, primary cemented hip arthroplasty, primary cementless hip arthroplasty, revision hip arthroplasty, and a variety of bearing surface options.

They would be expected to engage in an audit and in a research project. They would be expected to present their experience at the British Hip Society meeting, and to write up their experience for The British Hip Society newsletter.

There would also be the potential to attend visiting surgeon programmes and cadaveric/educational events at Smith & Nephew facilities.

The British Hip Society and Smith & Nephew, are open to fellows suggesting the units they would like to spend time in.

The British Hip Society and Stryker Fellowship.

The British Hip Society and Stryker Fellowship will allow one or two fellows to spend a period of one to four weeks at centres with an interest in robotic or computer-assisted surgery. There will be opportunities in the UK, in London, Edinburgh, Exeter, and opportunities in Europe in Germany, Italy, and Luxembourg. We have earmarked 6000 Euros to cover Fellow travel and expenses and 2750 Euros to cover host site costs for each of 2 fellows.

The successful fellows would also be given the opportunity to attend Stryker courses and selected events.

The fellows would be expected to produce a report at the end of the fellowship, both for Stryker and for The British Hip Society, and would be expected to present at The British Hip Society annual meeting.

The British Hip Society and Zimmer-Biomet Fellowship.

The British Hip Society and Zimmer-Biomet Fellowship is aimed to provide an exciting opportunity for a young consultant or a senior fellow to spend six months to one year, gaining experience in any of a number of possible centres. The successful candidate would be expected to be exposed to all aspects of primary, complex primary and revision hip arthroplasty. Total funds available to cover fellow stipend and hosting sites amount to £56000.

The successful fellow would be given subsistence and travel expenses and would be expected to provide a report to The British Hip Society and Zimmer-Biomet at the end, as well as to be able to present key messages from their experience at The British Hip Society annual meeting.
